Full Day Class for 2021:

Nancy Mahoney will present a 6-hour Class on Friday, February 12, 2021 and a Lecture at our Guild meeting on Saturday, February 13, 2021. She lives only 3 hours from Savannah. Paper piecing is one of her specialties. We have determined that an interesting class will be her Tilted Tile Block – see picture below.

Notice the many small pieces used to create this block. I count 21 pieces for $1/4^{th}$ of the 4-section block. It allows for the look of curves in the finished block. While it sounds complicated, it is a class that will open your eyes to the possibilities of paper piecing and how methodical it can be.

In the meantime, check out her website at **nancymahoney.com** to learn more about her and the Class.


