Thank you, June Alston, for the wonderful 2-part workshop on making the Mondo Bag! The tutorials are so clear and detailed that I was able to finish my bag without any glitches. Renee made the smaller version; I'm eager to see the finished bag at our November meeting. If there are any members who missed the opportunity to make their own Mondo bag, please contact me. The tutorials are video taped and are available for the regular workshop fee of \$20.00 for the pair.



In **November** we'll have a fun workshop led by Carol Vondeylen, instructing the group in making Fidget quilts. These small washable quilts can be made for babies or for seniors with dementia. The quilts have a variety of tactile features: zippers, buttons, ribbons, tassels, rickrack, plastic thread spools (empty),...nearly anything that is safe and can survive the wash machine. Carol has plenty of supplies and I'm going through the tons of items I've accumulated over the years, so plan on bringing your machine, pins, and some thread, and, if you like, any bits & pieces that might be added to the quilt. The fee will be \$20.00. The workshop will be held at the Talahi Community Center, with social distancing procedures in place.

There is **no workshop planned for December**.

As we're approaching 2021, please consider what you'd be interested in as an after-meeting workshop. We have some topics that we had to cancel earlier this year and we hope to hold those workshops in the coming year.


