March 2022: Ombre Table Runner with Jeanne Reinisch

Jeanne took one piece of gradient fabric and turned out a simple table runner with a sophisticated color design. There will be a general post on the SQG website regarding fabric, sewing tools, etc. No need for a pattern, just a ruler and rotary cutter. The posting will offer suggestions for selecting fabrics so start your fabric search now. If you're looking for an easy project that can be completed quickly, this is the one! All aspects of foundation paper piecing will be covered, including how to correctly position the right fabric piece.
