Hello Everyone!

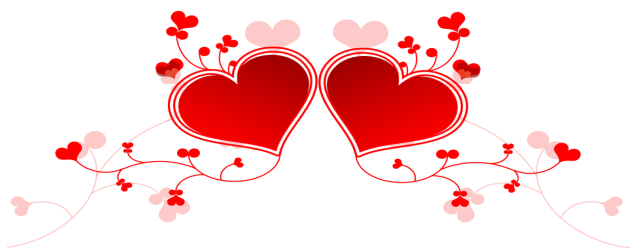

February workshop: with Cat Allard

Cat will have great information about how to preserve and repair our quilts, both old and new. If you have signed up and not paid yet, remember to Zelle, Venmo, or bring a check. If you haven't signed up, I encourage you to sign up with Jan Howard at the February meeting. I'm sure you will be glad you did! Don't forget to bring your lunch if you are staying. You don't want to get hungry.

March workshop: with Cheryl Dingledine "Me" on "No Sew Rope Baskets".

The February meeting will have the sign-up sheet if you didn't get to put your name down. We will have 2 methods to create some great looking and useful baskets. Supplies needed are 100 feet of cotton clothesline, available at local stores. Home Depot, Lowe's, Ace Hardware and Walmart and also online on Amazon. A glue gun with low temp, glue sticks and if you want to decorate with color strips of fabric cut on the diagonal (a yard will be more than enough). The second method would use yarn wrapped around the rope and threaded through so glue would not be needed. It's a great opportunity to use up leftover yarn

Note: February meeting, we will bring in our first fat quarter for the Christmas exchange. Jan will also collect those. (Jan you are a Rockstar!) The color is white, gray, or pattern that reminds you of winter (no Christmas).

Barn Quilt Painting Workshop
Friday, April 14, 2023

Join us as Suzi Parron presents her Barn Quilt Painting Workshop. Members of the class will paint a 24" x 24" wood quilt block. Suzi will have the pre-primed squares and suggested patterns, paints and foam brushes and other tools ready to launch us into this special experience. How are barn quilts made? The very first barn quilts were painted directly on the surface of the barn. Local artists were employed in painting the blocks, but the process was time consuming. Soon the method was changed, and painters began creating quilt blocks on wood, which was then mounted on the barns. A full-sized barn quilt is eight-by-eight feet, which requires two full sheets of plywood, mounted side by side. Many barn quilts are simply painted on plywood, which is first sanded and primed. More recently, barn quilt painters have been using MDO sign board, which is a bit more expensive but easier to work with, as the surface is smooth. The paint used is exterior latex or acrylic, the same type of paint that is used for houses. Once the design is drawn onto the boards, each section is outlined with painters' tape and then painted with several coats.

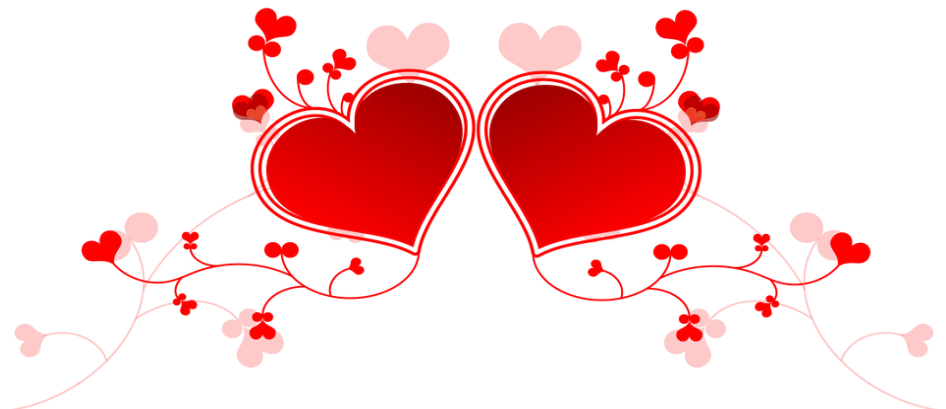
