- *Deb Brown found the Brother Quilt Gripper to be useful.
- *Terry Duncan loves the Clover Needle Threader.
- *Carol Richards shared Liquid Stitch. She uses it on her bindings. "Glue first, stitch second"
- *Shauna Radunzel really likes her Dynamic Walking Foot by Brother.
- *Cindy Stuart uses Bloc Loc rulers and a small Fiskar spinning mat to square up her blocks.
- *Jan Howard visits her kitchen and gets her wooden spatula when she needs to push out the edges of turned circles.
- *Jennifer Farago uses the black and white/mono setting on her iPhone camera to determine value in her projects.
- *Lisa Stephens likes the quilt as you go hexagons she found at Missouri Star.
- *Marilyn Smith can't live without her Karen Kay Buckley Perfect Scissors. She has at least one of every size. The serrated edge is the key!
- *Emily Robertson Hood found a great marking pen at Joann Fabric. It is marked as a Disappearing Fine Point made in Japan. No more disappearing marks until you actually want them to go away!
- Vicki Hammond Smith gets rubber shelf liner at the Dollar Store and uses small pieces to grip her fabric while quilting.

- *Jenny Mullins found some great Bobbin Toppers at Joann Fabrics. This handy gadget lets you keep your thread and bobbins matched up nicely.
- *Rita Richey and Karen Hayes sometimes have to "edit" their stitches and for this they use a seam ripper/tweezer combo from Famore.
- *Judy Lindsey likes the grippiness of Quilters Select Rulers..... until she needs to slide the ruler. The Qypsy Quilter suction handle/gripper solves this predicament. Quilters Select also sells a similar gripper product.
- *Mary Bell Fuller and *Kim Hayes are making a By Annie ruler tote and have found the half round Strip Stick useful for pressing seams open. Kim also shared a technique using a strip of selvage to turn fabric tubes right side out.
- *Mary Bass showed us a small sewing basket that she received as a gift. The wooden handle has a wooden spindle that holds a spool of thread. There is a pin cushion inside the basket. She thinks it might have been made in Vermont. She also uses a telescoping magnet tool from Harbor Freight to round up stray pins. Mary also shared a unique needle gripper. She is going to find out more about the brand and share the info.
- *Glenda Kipp uses tweezers at her sewing machine to pull threads from places they don't need to be in. She finds it extremely useful!
