

Member Spotlight July 2023

I'm excited to welcome 5 new fascinating members who joined the guild June 2023: Cindy Wallace, Mitzi Crow, Sheryl St. Germain, Justin Lane and Christina Negrea. Read more about two of them below.

Mitzi Crow was born in Chicago Illinois but now lives in Rincon, Georgia. She was inspired by her aunt who taught her to quilt and encouraged her to join a quilt guild. For the last 30 years, she has been in employed by Publix in various capacities and is currently a baker. She has been quilting for 10 – 12 years, successfully completed 5 quilts and has MANY UFO's. Mitzi enjoys many styles of quilting and does not consider herself a specific type of quilter. She sews for family and friends with the ultimate goal of selling her quilts. She sews on a Brother quilting machine and describes her fabric stash as "needing more fabric" stating that she only has enough fabric for a couple more quilts. On advice of her aunt, she saves every scrap in hopes of one day making something amazing.

Sheryl St. Germain, a native of New Orleans, Louisiana moved to Savannah 2 years ago from Pittsburg, PA. She is an acclaimed author and poet publishing many books with her latest being "50 Miles" which can be found on Amazon. She has taught creative writing in the MFA programs at several colleges and universities. Sheryl started out as a traditional quilter as a means of expressing the grief of her son. After studying under Nancy Crow, she has evolved into an improvisational quilter dying her own fabric with earth mineral dyes. She mainly makes art quilts that can be found for sale at the Kobo Art Gallery in Savannah. She uses her fabric scraps to make post cards and bookmarks then gives the rest to Goodwill. Sheryl is also a member of the Savannah Fiber Guild.
