Marking pen (water or heat pens)

One light/neutral background fabric 22x22



Please join me in welcoming Michael Sengstack who joined September 2023. Read about previous new members, Mary Halfpenny and Diane Burch below.

Mary Halfpenny moved to Savannah nearly 20 years ago, escaping the harsh northern winters of Ohio to be closer to her family in Florida. She is a retired Registered Nurse who graduated from Penn State University in her hometown of State College, Pennsylvania. Mary has always loved hand work so her quilting journey was a natural progression from hand needle work and embroidery. She has taken many quilting classes from well-known quilt artist. With a plan to fill her time quilting after retirement, she spent many years traveling to various quilt shops and quilt shows collecting fabric. Now she describes her fabric stash as "overflowing and needs to be used". She is a big fan of Kaffe Fassett and loves any ocean related themed fabric. She met Deb Brown after moving to Savannah and Deb became her travel buddy. They toured Georgia, Florida, South Carolina, and North Carolina to find "just the right fabric" for her projects. During their travels, Mary instilled many life lessons. Mary took Deb to her very first quilt show in Jacksonville, Fl.

**Diane Burch** moved to Darien, Georgia about a year ago from the Atlanta area where she started a Quilting Bee. She is a native of Chicago, Illinois but grew up in Ohio. She is currently employed as a Software Implementation Specialist and serves as Senior Vice President of the company. Although her quilting journey started many years ago, when her mother was involved in a quilt guild, she became serious about it 15 years ago. Diane considers herself an "eclectic" quilter who began as a traditional quilter and transitioned to a modern style. Her quilts are given away to family, friends and charities. Diane enjoys rescuing quilt tops and quilts from estate sales and finishing or repairing them. She has a large stash of fabric that includes designers like Kaffe Fassett and Tula Pink as well as many batiks and other quilting cottons. Her favorite sewing machine is by Janome. Diane's goal is own a computerized quilting machine so she could quilt her own quilts.
