All you need to bring is:

Glue gun. (If you don't have one I'm sure people will share)

Glue sticks

Scissors

Needle and thread

Embroidery thread

2.5 in squares if you want to use your own fabric. 40 for ball ornament, 32 for wreath, 40 for acorn

Any embellishments you would like and spare bits of ribbon

Marilyn was a past President of the Savannah Quilt Guild, a quilt workshop teacher, a diverse quilter, a knitter, a former business owner, a cat lover, a mom, a grandma, a friend. She could design a quilt or follow a pattern and excelled in creating traditional and modern quilts. She participated in many quilt shows and quilt displays. In the past, Marilyn owned a needlepoint shop in New York state where she also designed needlepoint patterns and taught people how to needlepoint.

Her 3 kids and the grandkids have many of her quilts and according to her daughter, Heather, also many knitted socks. When Marilyn found a twist to her many talents, she took it seriously and shared her talents and her creations, especially with her family!

Per a request from the family, Marilyn wanted charity donations to made to the Humane Society of Greater Savannah after her passing. Her last kitty was a rescue from the Humane Society. As a result, \$2,800 raised by the Guild was donated to the Humane Society of Greater Savannah in her memory.
