



Member Spotlight October

We are excited to have two new members, Joni Short and Lois Diederich. Read more about them along with Jeanie Eckman who joined last month.

Joni Short is a native of Tampa, Florida but grew up in a rural town, Patchogue, New York from the age of 3. She attended Nursing school at the Augusta College in Georgia and is now retired from the JC Lewis Cancer Research Center. Joni started quilting in 2004 when a fellow employee asked to be talked out of purchasing a Bernina sewing machine from Colonial Quilts. Instead, Joni purchased the machine, started taking classes and immediately became hooked on quilting. She considers herself a modern quilter and has made more than 20 quilts. Although many of her quilts are given to family and friends, some quilts have been auctioned for the cancer support group in Augusta. She describes her stash as a combination of styles of fabric from Batiks, to Kaffe Fassett, Tula Pink and many holiday novelty fabrics. She also has a huge stash of flannels that she plans to use to make rag quilts. To conquer her fear of cutting fabric, she has set a goal of making a paper-pieced Judy Niemeyer quilt pattern for 2024.

Lois Diederich was born in Metter, Georgia but has lived in Meldrim, Georgia for the last 50 years. She retired 6 years ago from the Southern Charm Embroidery Company as the owner and operator with her daughter. This freed her to have more time for quilting. Lois was inspired by her sister-in-law and learned to quilt while visiting Arkansas but never had the time to pursue her passion. Since 2020, she has made over 12 quilts. Lois' daughter sleeps under the very first quilt she ever made. Loving a challenge, Lois mastered the double wedding ring quilt and entered it in Georgia State Fair 2023, winning a 2nd place ribbon. She has made 5 others as wedding gifts with family members asking for more. Her favorite sewing machine is an old Elna but also uses her new Babylock Crescendo. Lois describes her fabric stash as "a mess" with fabric and buckets of scraps everywhere. She buys whatever fabric that looks pretty. Lois is thrilled to be a guild member and is interested in learning to paper-piece.

Jeanie Eckman is originally from Northern Georgia but moved to Savannah at the age of 6 when her father found employment here. She has had an very successful career in the medical field working with computers. Her friend and co-worker, Cathy Padgett introduced her to quilting at Colonial Quilts over 30 years ago. Jeanie started out as a traditional quilter but now considers herself a modern quilter. She enjoys embroidery and paper-piecing but is not a fan of applique. She is now tackling free-motion quilting, a skill that she says is challenging. She enjoys going to quilt shows with the one in Houston, Texas being her favorite. Jeanie refers to her fabric stash as "a mess" with lots of fabrics designed by Tula Pink, Kaffe Fassett and Tim Holtz. She has many Bernina sewing machines, but her latest acquisition is Babylock Accomplish. She is currently employed with her friend, Cathy Padgett again at Sew Much More Quilt Shop. Her motto is: "If you see something you like, buy it now because it may not be there when you return."
