Member Spotlight October By Deb Brown

Please extend a warm welcome to our newest member, **Jennifer Hodge** who joined December 2023. I have been requested by the members to shine the spotlight on our President, **Kim Hayes.**

Jennifer Hodge is originally from Houston, Texas but moved to Savannah for employment. She is the owner and operator of 3 food trucks, "Kona Ice of Savannah" that serves shaved ice. Jennifer is a brand new quilter so please be gentle with her. She was inspired to quilt by her grandmother who was an avid quilter. Like many other quilters, Jennifer is critical of her work stating her first quilt was a "disaster". She has learned a lot and her second quilt was "much better". Jennifer sews on an Elna sewing machine that she inherited from her grandmother's estate as well as a newer Singer sewing machine. She has no fabric stash (yet). But she does have a huge collection of her grandmother's quilts that is her inspiration. Jennifer finds piecing quilts to be relaxing and therapeutic. She plans to take private quilting lessons to improve her skills in 2024.

Kim Hayes is a native of Cincinnati, Ohio who moved to Savannah in 2018 to be close to her family. She is a retired Medical Technologist who worked in the hospital labs for 34 years. Kim has been sewing since the age of 12 and is from a family of quilters and crafters (mother, grandmother and sister). Kim has been sewing and crafting her entire life, making household items like curtains and bed skirts. Once she started quilting, she never looked back. It all began in 1991 when she and her sister took a "Quilt in a Day" class at a local quilt shop. Her very first quilt was a "floor quilt" used to "protect the carpet". Since then, she has excelled in her skills to the point of being 1st and 2 nd place winners in the Georgia National State Fair. Kim sews on Husqvarna Viking sewing machine and quilts her own quilts using a Handi Quilter sit-down longarm machine. She has a huge fabric stash filled with fabrics by designers like Kaffe Fassett, Tula Pink, Jenny Beyer and lots of Batiks. She also keeps every scrap of her fabrics even if there is no plan to use them. Kim has made over 25 guilts that have been given to family and friends. Kim has been a member of a quilt guild in Ohio and immediately joined the Savannah Quilt Guild when she moved here. She has served 2 terms as Vice-president and is currently her 2nd term as President.
