

### Member Spotlight October

We are thrilled to welcome six new members who joined March 2024: Jennifer Prazak, Grace Prazak, Phyllis Gudgalis, Cheri Leffler, Jessica Lankherst, and Jennifer Brown. Take a peek into the quilting lives of Jennifer Prazak, Phyllis Gudgalis, and Cheri Leffler.

**Jennifer Prazak** was born in Indianapolis, Indiana but moved to Texas after marriage. She is a retired Pharmacist who worked in New York as an Account Manager for the Hospital Alliance. She recently made Richmond Hill, Georgia her permanent address. She has always loved quilts and has a collection of family heirloom quilts made by her great-aunt. Jennifer's mother was a seamstress and taught her to sew. She began her quilting journey about 15 years ago after being inspired by Eleanor Burns with Quilt in a Day. Since then, she has made over 20 quilts. Her quilts are given as gifts and used throughout the home on the beds and walls. Since Jennifer mainly purchases fabric needed for particular projects, her fabric stash is small and consists mostly of scraps from previous projects. Jennifer sews on a Bernina 770 and also owns a Handi Quilter Longarm quilting machine. Her quilting expertise landed her the "Best in Show" award in the Rensselaer County Fair in New York. Jennifer's favorite aspects of quilting are piecing and applique.

**Phyllis Gudgalis** is not a quilter and has never made a quilt (YET). However, her love of handmade items using applique inspired her to join the guild. Phyllis is originally from the Bronx, NY. She and her husband spent 14 years traveling the United States in an RV before deciding to settle in Savannah to be close to family. Her hobbies include hand embroidery, punch needle, and English Paper piecing using hexagons. Her favorite YouTuber is Kate from "The Last Homely House".

**Cheri Leffler** is a native of Ohio and moved around the country as a child since her father was a minister. Cheri went to high school and college in Michigan where she studied Media Technology focusing on photography and graphic design. While there, she met and married her soulmate who joined the military and her cross-country travels continued. Cheri made her first quilt at age 16 when she was enamored by a quilt she saw on the front cover of the Better Homes & Gardens. Not knowing anything about quilting at the time, she just "figured it out." Her first quilt is still in use, although it is now embellished with life stains. In 2002, while living in Mississippi with no local quilt store, she decided to open one – "The Quilting Bee", a very successful business ultimately carrying over 6000 bolts of fabric. Cheri is multi-talented: she is a soloist, plays and teaches piano lessons, knits and crochets, an author of 2 quilt-ing books and designer of numerous quilting patterns. Her passion is hand applique and hand quilting. She has won Blue Ribbons and Judges Choice awards for her Baltimore Album Quilt in Mississippi and Houston. Cheri has started a family tradition of making double wedding ring quilts for her daughters when they marry. She is currently on #3 of 4.
