


Member Spotlight June

Please join me in extending a warm welcome to **Kathy M. Brown** who joined May 2024. Read more about Kathy and also **Machiell Futch** who joined April 2024 below.

Kathy Mulligan-Brown is originally from Garden City, NY. She retired 2 years ago after working for 38 years with the U.S. Customs Department as a Textile Analyst. She had a very interesting job analyzing various fibers such as yarn, fabric, hats, shoes, luggage, etc. When fibers come into the United States, some are tested randomly while others are sent to be tested when suspicion arises. The fibers are analyzed in a lab to confirm that the manufacture's labeling is accurate. For example, a fabric labeled 100 percent cotton is analyzed to ensure that it is actually 100 % cotton and not a blend of polyester or some other unknown fibers. If insects or pests are found, they are quarantined and sent to another division. Kathy also worked for the Butterick Pattern Company as a pattern checker to ensure that the sample garments matched the pattern exactly. If not, the garment would be sent back for corrections. She moved up in the company as a Craft Pattern Maker for items such as the Care Bears, Christmas ornaments, dolls, and doll clothing as well as puppets. Although Kathy has only made an Irish Chain baby quilt for her daughter many years ago, she was inspired by her mother to start quilting. Kathy inherited a huge stash of fabric from her mother who was an avid, award winning quilter in the Florida Keys. Kathy is anxious to start quilting and has enrolled in the Beginning Quilting Class at Savannah Sews Quilt Shop.

Machiell Futch was born and raised in Richmond Hill, GA. She retired from Gulfstream Aerospace after working 20 years as an Executive Assistant. Although Machiell is new to quilting, she is not new to sewing. She has been sewing since fifth grade when she won the sewing competition in the 4-H Club. Since then, she has repaired and made garments and costumes for her family. She has also made a couple of basic baby quilts. Machiell's grandmother was a passionate quilter and made a Dresden plate quilt for her wedding. She inherited a giant fabric stash including many flour sack cottons. She has many sewing machines such as a Babylock, a Janome and a serger. Machiell's other talents are knitting and crocheting. She took quilting classes from Sew Much More. Her first quilt remains unfinished, but with the encouragement of her newfound friends, that will change!
