Finished sized

60" x 10 2/8" [150 x 26 cm]

Material needed

- Stash of Scraps
- 2 Yard of backing fabric (can be any fabric)
- Embroidery threads for quilting and tassels



Cutting instruction

See the fabric selection

Block A

- 20 pcs. of 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" [11 x 11 cm]
- 40 pcs. of 2 3/8" x 2 3/8" [6 x 6 cm]

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Block B

- 14 pcs. of 3 1/2" x 4" [9 x 10 cm]
- 56 pcs. of 1 5/8" x 2" [4 x 5 cm]

Sashing strip

- 14 pcs. of 1 5/8" x 6 1/8" [4 x 15.5 cm]

Backing Panel

- 1 pc of 12" x 62" [30 x 157 cm]



Piecing Block A

1. Align 2 small squares right side together. Pin and sew with 1/4" [0.25 cm] seam allowance.
2. Press to open seam allowance on the wrong side.
3. Align the sewn piece with the big square (4 1/2" x 4 1/2" [11 x 11 cm]) right side together. Pin and sew with 1/4" [0.5 cm] seam allowance.
4. Press to open seam at the back

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Lay out block as diagram below. Align block A and block B with sashing strip in between. Pin and sew with 1/4" [0.5 cm] seam allowance. Press to open seam on the wrong side. You will need 14 of block C in total.

Block C (Block A + Block B + Sashing Assembly)



1. Align the long side of 2 small rectangles right side together. Pin and sew with 1/4" [0.5 cm] seam allowance.
2. Press to open seam allowance on the wrong side.
3. Repeat step 1-2 to another set of rectangular.
4. Align seam of 2 sewn pieces, right side together. Pin and sew with 1/4" [0.5 cm] seam allowance.
5. Press to open seam allowance on the wrong side.
6. Align the 3 1/2" [9 cm] side of sewn piece and the big rectangle, right side together. Pin and sew with 1/4" seam allowance
7. Press to open seam allowance on the wrong side.

Block B



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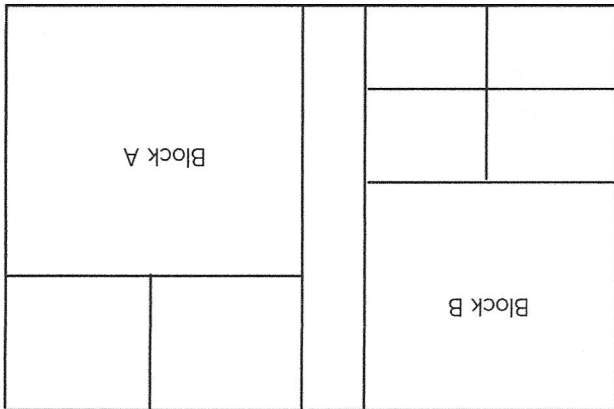


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One big block has 3 block C and 1 block A. Put them as diagram below. It is a kind of free style quilting. Just lay them in crisscross way.

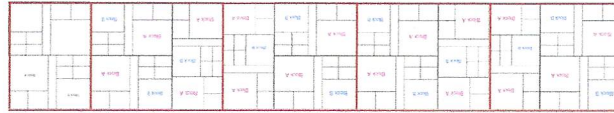
Big Block Assembly



This scarf requires 4 big blocks and 2 block C

Scarf Front Panel Assembly

Lay them on the flat surface as below diagram. Start sewing each big block together. Press to open seam on the wrong side.



Front and Back Panel Assemble

1. Align raw edge of front and back panels, right side together. Pin around 3 sides of the panel. Leave one end opened. Sew the pinned 3 sides. Snip the corners so you won't have thick corners when turning.
2. Turn right side out. Make sure the corners is pulled all the way out. Press to have crisp and flat seam.
3. At the opening end, tuck raw edge inside and press. Pin. We will sew this part when adding the

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fringes.
 4. Add running stitch to the scarf. Take the embroidery thread only 3 out of 6 flosses. Make running stitch next to all seams.



Adding The Fringes

1. Get a cardbord or anything with 4" [10 cm] wide. Wrap the thread or twine around the cardboard until you get the desire thickness. I wrapped about 15 rounds. Cut off. This is 1 fringe. Make about 20 fringes. I put 10 for each end. Use removable pen to make marks at each end on the back side. Each mark is about 1" [2.5 cm] apart. You will have about 10 marks.

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3. Put the fringe on each mark at the back of scarf. Sew over each fringe back and forth. Repeat this step to all 20 fringes. After finish attaching all the fringes, sew one long stitch line to close all the opening.

4. Lay the fringes on the cutting mat and straighten them nicely. Use a ruler and rotary cutter to cut all the tips of the fringes. So you will have nice and even fringes.



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
